

# Dear Friends and Supporters,

Thank you for your ongoing commitment to One for the World! This report explains how OFTW has performed on its key metrics over the past 6 months, and provides an update on our direction as an organization. We're thrilled to share our progress, particularly on the 3 goals we outlined during our last update.

- We've increased our reach. In 2014, we formed our first chapter at the Wharton School of Business. Three years later, we have expanded our reach to new schools including Harvard, MIT, and Columbia. And this is just the beginning.
- We've grown our impact. We have raised over \$110K to date and are on track to reach ~\$200K by the end of the year. This money has made a life-saving impact on 40,000 people living in extreme poverty.
- We've accelerated our growth through partnerships. Through our collaboration with The Life You Can Save, we have gained additional resources and are better positioned to scale across more universities. The Life You Can Save helps fund our overhead expenses, provides access to thought leaders in the non-profit world, and spearheads our charity selection process.
- We've updated the charities we recommend. After completing our annual review of the most effective charities, we've updated the portfolio of charities we recommend and our 'Top Picks.' 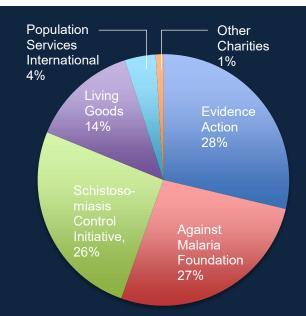




## **Donations**

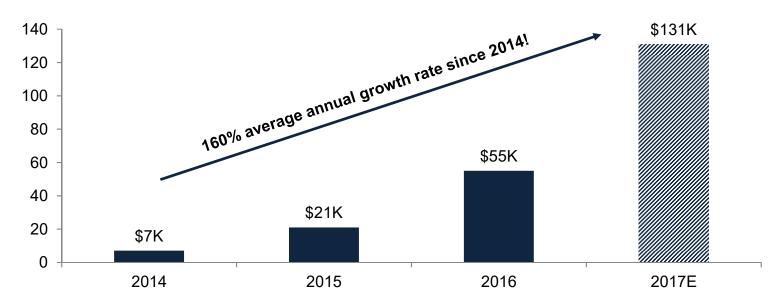
As of April 2017, there have been \$110K in OFTW donations.

# AGAINST MALARIA FOUNDATION



Provided **10K+** bednets to protect those living in malaria-stricken areas from infected mosquitos



Protected **15K+** people from malaria for three to four years on average

# **EVIDENCE ACTION**



Dewormed 136K+ children



Provided safe drinking water to **16K+** community members for one year

#### SCHISTOSOMIASIS CONTROL INITIATIVE



Protected **34K+** children from schistosomiasis for one year, preventing life-threatening conditions including bladder cancer, kidney malfunction, spleen damage, and anemia

# Partnership with The Life You Can Save

In October, we announced our new partnership with The Life You Can Save (TLYCS), an advocacy and educational outreach organization that raises awareness for the ~700M men, women, and children living in extreme poverty. TLYCS was founded by world-renowned Princeton ethicist and philosopher Peter Singer, who was deemed "the world's most influential living philosopher" by The New Yorker.

Our organizations are both committed to helping the world's poor by providing educational outreach and a donation platform to facilitate life-saving donations. TLYCS has provided One for the World with access to thought leadership, funding, infrastructure, and part-time staff.

#### **OUR CHARITY SELECTION PROCESS**

We have leveraged TLYCS's expertise to further improve our own charity selection process. TLYCS uses a panel of world-renowned experts to assess research by independent charity evaluators, including GiveWell and Impact Matters, and select a portfolio of charities. The result is a list of charities that is more comprehensive than any of the lists produced by any individual charity evaluator. Donors can be confident that a donation to any of the charities recommended will make a real difference in the lives of the world's poorest people. Refer to our blog post from February of this year if you'd like to learn more.

Our charity recommendations are based on three criteria, which we call "the three E's".

- Evidence: why do we believe the charity produces good outcomes? We consider the size, quality, and relevance of the evidence base for the charity
- **Efficiency**: how cost-effective are the charity's programs? We want to find charities that offer the most "bang for the buck"
- Execution: Do we believe the charity can translate marginal donations into good outcomes? We consider whether the charity has good programs in need of incremental funding and the capability to execute those programs

Our process is spearheaded by a panel of world-renowned experts. As a result of our partnership with TLYCS, our portfolio has expanded to include 18 organizations, though we continue to recommend 5 'Top Picks' to our members each year. This expansion helps OFTW address a wider range of societal issues and also appeal to a broader base of donors, while remaining committed to our core mission.

AGAINST MALARIA FOUNDATION

Uses 100% of donations to buy longlasting insecticidal nets (LLINs) that protect people from malaria



FRED HOLLOWS FOUNDATION

Restores sight to 2M+ people and aims to end avoidable blindness through low-cost eye surgery (for as little as \$50 per patient), doctor training, and community education



**IODINE GLOBAL NETWORK** 

Works to prevent brain damage for pennies a person so all children can reach their full cognitive potential



POPULATION SERVICE INT'L

Addresses major health challenges in the developing world, including family planning, HIV/AIDS, maternal health, and child mortality



SEVA

Serves nearly one million children and adults in 20 countries yearly, and provide an array of services including \$50 vision-restoring cataract surgeries

Uses radio and TV campaigns on health issues to change behaviors and save lives

Supplies smallholder farmers with financing and training to grow their way out of hunger and poverty

Supports food fortification, one of the most effective, affordable, and sustainable means of preventing disabilities and deaths globally

Supports obstetric fistula repair, moving women from social ostracism to reentry into family and community
